**Dear Parents and Caregivers** 

### Year 7-9 Remote Learning – Term 2

Thank you for the support you have shown during this challenging time. We understand that there are many changes happening in the lives of families. Despite all that is changing around us, it is reassuring to know that our God remains unchanging. Hebrews 13:8 reminds us that *Jesus Christ is the same yesterday and today and forever*.

The Middle School Team has been planning and preparing for remote learning in Term 2. We hope that this letter and the links included, will provide you with clarity around what this will look like.

To assist families in maintaining healthy routines at home during this time, we have provided a structure for students to follow (please see below). Students will follow their normal daily timetable structure during this season of remote learning. We understand that there are significant differences having students learning from home and we want to reassure you that the workload within each subject will be closely monitored. Students will continue to receive clear instructions for each subject through Google Classroom. Your child's teachers will be available during the normal lesson times.

#### **Pastoral Care**

Home Group will continue to be an important time of connection and community. Students will connect using a link in their Home Group's Google Classroom to join a Google Meet video conference each morning. It is here that their Home Group teacher will record attendance for the day as per government requirements. # **Use of Technology**

To ensure your child is safe when working online we recommend the following:

- Your child uses their Chromebook in an open location (ie not in their bedroom with the door closed).
- Your home internet filtering is adequate.

Whilst technology is an amazing tool that allows remote learning to take place, there are ways to reduce the quantity of screen time your child has. This includes making the most of non-screen based tasks by completing work on paper when appropriate (ie using a Maths textbook and exercise book to complete questions, reading, active break times, etc).

## **Subject Specific Information**

# **English**

For Term 2, each English teacher has planned work designed to enable the students to progress well through the English curriculum with success and progress, while working from home. Teachers will regularly post the student work requirements and will be available during the normal timetabled lesson times for feedback and advice. Teacher instruction will also be provided using Screencastify, and there may be opportunity for student interaction using Google Meet. This will all be accessed on Google Classroom.

Some students need to borrow a class text from the Library. This will have been communicated to them on Google Classroom. If they have not yet borrowed the text, it will be available for collection on Wednesday 8 or Thursday 9 April at Student Services.

#### **Mathematics**

All Mathematics classes will have a sequence of work accessible on Google Classroom. This will be updated regularly to pace students appropriately in the work and allow the work to be complemented by resources including pre-recorded videos and video conferencing. Students should be checking Google Classroom for updates during their normal class times.

There will be regular formative items for students to complete to confirm their progress and allow feedback to students on their understanding. During remote learning, the nature of Maths tests will need to be modified and further detail of this will be communicated to students through Google Classroom prior to assessments taking place.

In regards to extension classes, there will be no movement of students into the extension classes while teaching and learning is done remotely to maintain continuity for students. When on-site learning resumes, the opportunity for some students to move to the extension classes will be looked at again.

# **Health and Physical Education**

All Middle School H&PE students will be required to complete a personal electronic workbook that is made up of weekly set tasks that vary from specific questions to creative tasks relating to the Health Benefits of Physical Activity. Each week your H&PE teachers will upload information and support materials to your Google Classroom page, and your teacher will be available at select lesson times to answer questions that you may have. Prior to starting Week 1 of Term 2, students will need their personal Chromebooks with access to Screencastify, their A4 display folders (to store any their creative tasks), ruler, general pens, pencils, textas and A4 paper for creative tasks. Please make sure you have access to these items.

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#### Music

Students will be working on units specifically for learning remotely. Weekly updates in regards to tasks and assessments will be provided through Google Classroom or Google Meets. Ensemble rehearsing and performances will be challenging in a remote setting; however, staff will offer meaningful ways for students to engage in practical music-making activities. Students will need access to the internet to stream and record video and audio on their devices. They will need a safe and appropriate space for playing their instrument. For instrumental tuition details, see the relevant paragraph included later in this letter.

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#### Year 7-10 Drama

Students will be working on small units, created by the curriculum teachers, specifically for learning in distance mode. Students will have digital workbooks to work through for each unit and will be supported by their teachers through Google Classroom. Students will need access to the internet to stream performances and also a camera. This may be the camera in their Chromebooks or a mobile/tablet device. Students will need a SAFE space to move in. This may include a grassed area or a large space in a living area to film performance work in.

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#### **Home Economics**

Home Economics content for students will be delivered each lesson, with weekly worksheets and evaluations as part of their written component. Year 8s and 9s will also have an assignment task which they will be given to work on.

- The Year 7 Course will comprise four weeks of Sewing & four weeks of Cooking.
- The Year 8s will be focusing on Food and Nutrition.
- The Year 9s will be focusing on either Food & Nutrition or Sewing and Textiles for the term, depending on their class.

Students who are doing a **Sewing unit** will be doing hand-sewn projects and have a **Take-home pack** to be collected from the college on **Thursday this week**, or **Monday of Week 1** next term at the latest.

Students will have weekly goals to meet on their projects.

For students who are focusing on Cooking units:

- Students will put their cooking skills into action each week at home.
- A focus will be on making good decisions around food at this time.
- The aim of these recipes is to give them valuable experience in the kitchen, but only under your supervision, so please ensure you come to a friendly agreement about this with your child.
- To minimise any pressure for you around cooking, we will be giving students a number of low-cost recipe options, so that they can make choices according to what you may have at home or can still access, or they could prepare a related recipe of your choice.
- Additionally, if you have any concerns, please email your child's teacher, or myself so that we can still find some ways for your child to be cooking.

Students will communicate and check in for each lesson through Google Classroom, which they are already very familiar with. Students will also be asked to send photos of their practicals.

Thank you for your support through this time, and encouragement of practical ways for your child to develop skills, awareness and creativity, in a different format.
