From the Deputy Principal

Dear Parents and Friends

Last week's 'Pathway Planning Day' for Senior School students gave an opportunity for students and parents to discuss their child's subject choices and proposed future pathways. It was encouraging to see the high attendance and willingness of parents to collaborate with their children in this process. This can be both an exciting time for students as they explore opportunities for the future, but also stressful for some students and parents as they navigate the process.

While student interests may change, and the direction can seem uncertain, it is important to keep pathway options open while pursuing areas of strength, gifting and passion.

In the coming weeks, Year 7 to Year 9 students will also start to make important subject choices.

By engaging in conversations with our students, parents and teachers can help students make effective subject and career choices.

Help students understand their unique design

- Make connections between their interests and possible career options
- Use results from personality, skills and interest testing done at school
- God's gifting, interest and direction for their life

Expose students to a wide range of careers

- Help widen their vision of potential career paths, and transferable skills
- Discuss jobs held by extended family members or friends, whom they can talk to, to gain a deeper understanding
- Explore options offered at Tertiary Education level

Model good career and life planning skills

- Talk about how your interests, skills and values, led you to your work, hobbies and other activities you enjoy doing
- If your work had been disappointing, how you made steps to explore changes or other career paths

Help students make relevant subject choices

- Subjects that align with their interests and abilities, yet still challenge and extend, will see the best outcomes
- Consider assumed knowledge for future study or specific career paths
- If unsure of future pathways, chose subjects that potentially keep options open

Our prayer is that students will find an enjoyable and fulfilling career path, which matches their God-given passions, interests and abilities. *(For we are God's handiwork, created in Christ Jesus to do good works, which God prepared in advance for us to do. Ephesians 2:10)*

As children of the Living God, may our students hear His call on their lives, knowing that their worth and identity is found in Him, who created them. *(Whatever you do, work at it with all your heart, as working for the Lord, not for human masters, since you know that you will receive an inheritance from the Lord as a reward. It is the Lord Christ you are serving. Colossians 3:23)*

From the Library

Bookweek

Every year schools around the country acknowledge and celebrate books in general and the best books of that year, by highlighting a special week known as **'Bookweek'**. The Children's Book Council of Australia (CBCA) hosts the awards given for the best books of the year that are published in Australia. Authors and Publishers consider it an honour to be nominated, and Libraries and readers look forward to finding out which books have been honoured each year. The winners are usually advertised in the media and via the CBCA website.

Here at Emmaus, the Library staff create a whole term of focus on a selection of the nominated books, and we present those books within the Reception to Year 6 Library lessons with associated creative activities. (The Library ends up with the decorated 'treasure' that results from these creative investigations.)

This year the theme for Bookweek is **'Find your Treasure'**. This theme is designed to make you think about the 'treasure' that can be found in literature. What was your favourite Book Treasure as a child? Was there one character that resonated, or one story that has stayed with you or was there one book that you valued above all others? Think about books that have shaped you as an individual or that have stretched you... and share the 'treasure' of reading with your children. Promote reading in your family every week – and then every week can be Bookweek!

Book Piracy

Found treasure in a book and want to copy it? Then do not... without considering whether this is appropriate! Part of our responsibility as Library staff is to honour the writers of books and ideas by promoting correct use and referencing of books within an educational context. The Copyright Act does provide opportunity for some copying for Educational purposes, but everyone should realise that this does not mean that everything is 'free for all'. Older students are taught to reference the sources of their research and younger students are introduced to the concept of plagiarism and how this applies to them. But parents have a responsibility to encourage and talk about the idea of 'Intellectual Property' and to recognise the creators' right to be compensated and acknowledged for their work. (Note this also applies to artistic work – music, art, photographs, film). The impact of regular piracy (or intellectual theft) is that authors and artists do not get compensated for their hard work and that the industries that support them suffer decline. The internet lulls us all into a false understanding that it provides everything for 'free'. It may provide easy access, but it does not mean that everything we see on the internet is free. Many resources that we provide to students come at a cost to us, even though they are made freely available to students. Your local Public Library may provide free access for many 'treasures' such as books, magazines and audio books, but they (through Council rates and budgets) pay for the privilege too. BUT do make use of the wonderful opportunity that this is for your family – free access to wonderful treasures.

So, because it is Bookweek, it is a good time to remember that 'Finding your Treasure' does not mean stealing from others, but it can mean discovering a wonderful creative treasure of ideas. God is creative and we know that he has placed gifts and talents in his people to be shared, and that this is something worth discovering.

And do not forget the greatest treasure... His word to us.

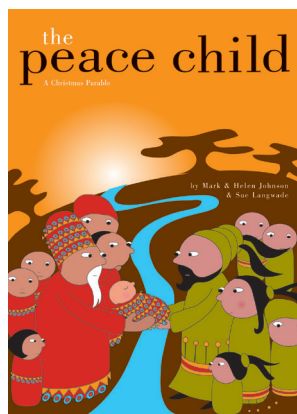

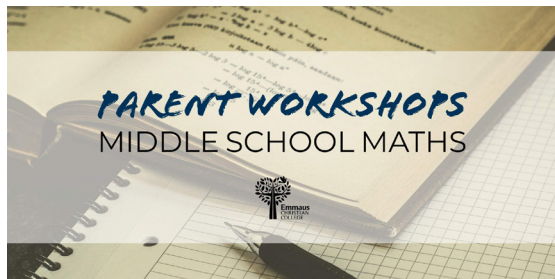
When you use this email address you can be assured that the information will be received by the First Aid Officer who is on duty at the time.

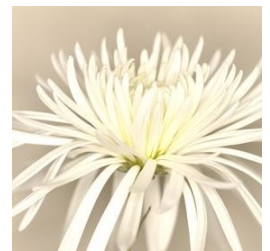
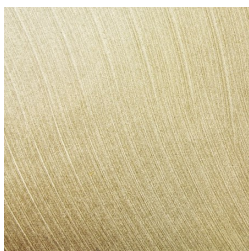
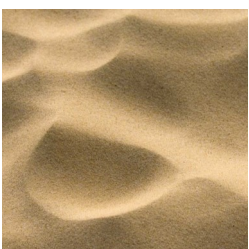
