# From the Principal

#### **Dear Families and Friends**

#### Romans 1:16-17 (NIV)

<sup>16</sup> "For I am not ashamed of the gospel, because it is the power of God that brings salvation to everyone who believes: first to the Jew, then to the Gentile. <sup>17</sup> For in the gospel the righteousness of God is revealed—a righteousness that is by faith from first to last,[a] just as it is written: The righteous will live by faith." [b]

I welcome you back to the second school term of 2018 with a reminder of true hope in Christ that sustains us irrespective of our worldly circumstances. This hope comes directly from the knowledge that our sins are laid on Christ and his righteousness is laid on us, and that this great exchange becomes ours not by works but by faith alone. *"By grace you have been saved through faith. And this is not your own doing; it is the gift of God, not a result of works, so that no one may boast"* **Ephesians 2:8–9**.

The last week of last term concluded with two particularly noteworthy community building events in the life of the College: Grandparents day and the Year 12 Formal. On Wednesday 11<sup>th</sup> April it was such a pleasure seeing our Performing Arts Centre literally bursting at the seams with the grandparents of approximate 300 Junior School students. Every Junior School Student participated throughout the program including all together in the signing of one highlight item, John Farnham's 1986 hit song "You're the Voice". The famous lyrics "We're all someone's daughter; We're all someone's son" was expanded upon during this item declaring that we are all loved children of our Father in heaven. The love our Year 12 parents have for their children was similarly evident on Friday 13<sup>th</sup> April when the annual Year 12 Formal commenced in the Emmaus Performing Arts Centre with some light refreshments and the all-important 'red-carpet' photo opportunity! It is always such a treat seeing our Year 12 students immaculately attired for this event, many departing the College for the exciting evening ahead in luxury chauffeured transportation! I personally thank all the staff and families for their time and energy coordinating these two important events in the life of the College. #### **NAPLAN** Testing

The annual Government NAPLAN tests for the nations Year 3, 5, 7 & 9 students are rapidly approaching with one key difference in 2018, most of the tests will be undertaken using a new 'on-line' format compared to the previous pencil and paper tests. Emmaus has undertaken extensive 'readiness' testing of our IT infrastructure over the last 6 months to ensure this format change will have no impact on our students. The tests are scheduled to be completed between 15<sup>th</sup> to 25<sup>th</sup> May, however Emmaus is intending to complete these tests during the first of these two weeks as has been the case previously. It is interesting to note that SACE is similarly transitioning to on-line exams at the end of Year 12, hence this is just a sign of the times!

#### **Oval Upgrade**

As many of you may have noticed over the last few years, our grassed area on the southern side of the campus (generally referred to as our 'oval' despite its rectangular shape!) has struggled as our student numbers have reached in excess of 700; and with a considerable increase in sporting programs providing opportunities for our students. The grass struggles the most during the winter months when growth of the hardier grass variety all but stops. Considerable exploration of options to improve this situation has taken place over the last 12 months including the relocation of some sporting events to neighbouring venues to reduce some of the higher impact use of this area. Exploration also included the assessment of installing a synthetic grass surface over this area.

Although visits to recently installed synthetic fields both in SA and interstate showcased the superiority of such synthetic surfaces for sports use, it remains the case that our oval is not purely a sports playing surface, but has considerable recreational use too. Unfortunately the superiority of new synthetic surfaces for sporting applications does not translate into pleasant recreational use too. For this reason Emmaus is further exploring alternatives to keeping and improve the quality of the natural grass surface of our oval. The first step of this improvement process will be to address the very low mains water pressure irrigation capability by the installation of a tank and high pressure pump system. This work already commenced over the most recent holidays with the installation of a small concrete tank pad adjacent to the north-west corner of the oval, and associated trenching for electrical and water supply. The plan is for this project to be completed ready for the start of the next growing season.
