Dear Parents and Friends

Year 10 Social Justice Camp, 12th – 14th September

Working together and looking beyond ourselves

Six teachers, one student teacher and one chaplain, as well as 60 of our students, spent three days last week at Nunyara campsite. Although the campsite was too close to home for feeling adventurous and outdoorsy, we managed to test ourselves in different ways.

During the three days, students were confronted with a day of group skill challenges and learning how, when they work as a team, good things can be achieved with clear communication and a sense of humour. The purpose of this day was to allow students to think outside themselves and work as a 'tribe' through a rotation of five activities.

The second part of the camp was set aside for exploring social justice: what it is and what it is not. We were all challenged to develop empathy for those who were down on their luck and to recognise that as an individual you could do something, yet as a group you could do even more. The challenge of finding your way around the city when you were homeless was brought home in a real way for our students.

There were also visits to social justice organisations, including a drug rehabilitation centre, for males only, and Catherine house, for females only, and two groups also attended Westcare which offers support for both males and females and consequently could have students of both genders attend their centre. Students were able to listen to peoples stories and get a sense of how life can change so quickly for a person. More importantly, they learnt what many people are doing to help those who are in that position. Interestingly, most of the organisations that provide this help are Church based. It says a lot for Christ's love in the world.

An evening highlight for our students was perhaps the Pop Up Op Shop fashion parade which gave students the chance to test their fashion sense and also think about conscientious fashion choices. Creativity was at a premium as outfits were constructed from second hand clothing and paraded to entertaining music. The finale of a 'repurposed' outfit for two suffering staff members was very memorable, as well as very amusing.

Staff were really happy with the level of participation of the students, they embraced the ideas of social justice and worked well together. A lot of fun was had by all, but even more importantly a bigger view of life was explored.


Children are a blessing from the Lord!

Student Wellbeing Coordinator

At Emmaus, we are very conscious of supporting our students and their families as they navigate their way through this tricky stage. On Friday, Week 7, all of Middle School celebrated together with our annual MS Wellbeing day. It was a terrific chance to focus on wellbeing and to encourage students to try new things. Soon our Year 9 students will be heading away on their Rite Journey camp. Please join our community to pray for our students and teachers as they undertake this challenging and rewarding opportunity.

Here are some thoughts on Middle School from the creator of The Rite Journey program - they are so insightful I am quoting the whole article from Andrew Lines. For more information on The Rite Journey program you can follow him online.

"As parents our job is to gradually step back and to help facilitate our child's shift into responsibility by building capacity and resourcefulness. It's exactly why I created The Rite Journey Parenting Plan. These skills need to be practised throughout their early teens as they near adulthood."

As the author of this article says:

"If I don't step back in middle school, when will I start? High school? College? His first job? When he's married with children? Every problem I solve simply delays the time when he'll take responsibility for himself..."

...Middle school is a dress rehearsal. It's almost always messy, and we worry that it foreshadows a disastrous future for our children. Meaning well, we jump in and initiate, fix and micromanage, telling ourselves we will stop when the child matures enough to take over. But middle school is supposed to be messy. It's how kids mature. This means making lots of mistakes, then experiencing consequences just strong enough to be an incentive for correction, but not strong enough to damage a life."

In her book, 'The Gift of Failure', Jessica Lahey points out that *"the ultimate goal of all parenting should be to help our children be autonomous and competent. With that goal in mind, I'm going to do things a bit differently with middle school this time around."*
